With some improvement in the economy, 2011 was a better year for us at AC-CESS than 2010, which was our hardest year financially by far. 2011 was still pretty hard, but our last fundraising dinner did raise enough to keep us going, so we continue to be thankful for your generosity and God's provision.

Some of you may know that because of our financial struggles, we were in danger of having to give up our (main) office space. 

ACCESS 2011 Report

I he economic crisis hit ACCESS hardest in 2010, with funding sources dropping significantly and the number of client sessions falling sharply, but we are hopeful as the economy begins to recover. The following diagrams depict the continuing overall increases in number of telephone and email inquiries (Fig. 1), since we began keeping records of them in at the end of 2005, as well as in the number of counseling clients served (Fig. 2). Note that Fig. 2 does not include the number of people served through our counseling groups and educational workshops and seminars.



As indicated in the diagrams above, more people continue to find out about ACCESS, and the needs are definitely out there! The number of inquiries had been our highest in 2010, but 2011 far exceeded the previous year's number! Even though we're a small organization, we still receive telephone calls from all around the country, from California to New York, and we have received email inquiries from as far away as Asia and Europe! Demand continues for our workshops and seminars. In 2011, we offered 14 workshops or talks to a total of about 200 people, with positive feedback on all of them. This time half of the programs were in an Asian language, mostly in Chinese, but with one of them being our first workshop translated into Korean! We also gave our first Youth and Parent Seminar! Aside from Asian language needs, we have also carried out our mission of more affordable counseling, especially to those in financial need, giving an average discount in 2011 of **60**% to our clients coming in for counseling, totaling over **\$1,600** (not including Barnabas Fund subsidies), with some clients receiving *as much as an 83*% *discount!*

There is no doubt about the great need for services such as ours, and that we can begin to fill the void of counseling services for the Asian and Asian American population in the Metro Atlanta area, if not beyond. Because of the need, the lack of such services available in the area, and the positive responses we receive from people as they find out about us, and more importantly because of the call to this mission, we are confident that ACCESS can grow in order to help meet those needs, but we cannot do it alone. Every year there are many important budgeted expenses which we have to cut or do without due to lack of funds. With the recent economic crisis, we have seen some of our most difficult times financially, in 2009 even having to cut personnel costs, and 2010 seeing our all-time lowest income level, but we are thankful that 2011 was not as low as 2010 (2011 Total Income: \$64,022.81). Over the years, we have been operating on an average of only about 45% of our budgeted needs, with 2011 falling as low as 31% of our budget (2011 Total Expenses: \$53,485.70). We greatly need your help, and we are grateful for those of you who have already shown us so much support. Although there are more people supporting us in various ways, we acknowledge our 2011 donors on pages 2, 5 and 6.

The full financial statements are available for review upon request at our offices during normal business hours with reasonable notice. The financial statements of Asian Christian Counseling & Educational Seminar Services, Inc. (ACCESS) have been reviewed by Director/Treasurer, Joe Tai, Certified Public Accountant according to the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles of AICPA.

Congratulations to our female Chinese bilingual counselor **Ruth Wu** on passing her Board exams and receiving her Associate's License! She is now officially a **LAPC** (Licensed Associate Professional Counselor) in Georgia and is continuing to work on her hours toward full licensure.

ACCESS Seminar Recordings Available

Just a reminder that some of our ACCESS Seminar recordings are currently available to those who are interested, whether you were unable to attend a particular seminar, wanted to give the recordings to friend who might benefit, or enjoyed the seminars so much you want a recording to review again in the future!

You can now order either **audio** (playable on CD players and most computers) or **data** (playable on computers only) **CD's of select ACCESS seminars and workshops**. Seminars currently available on CD are: "How To Discipline Your Children" (ACCCN Parenting Seminar - in Chinese only, 4/30/11), "Asian American Women's Mental Health" (AARC Asian American Women's Health Fair Workshop - English with Korean translation, 5/10/11), "Facing Stress, Loss, and Suffering in Today's World" (ACCC Seminar - in Chinese only, 8/20/11), and "Out of the Dark Valleys: Emerging from Crises in Work, Family, and Ministry" (ACCC Seminar - in Chinese only, 4/14/12).

The seminar of "How To Discipline Your Children" contains a brief introduction by Rebekah Wang in English, followed by Dr. Edward Lai's workshop on "The Purposes and Principles of Discipline" in Chinese, and Ruth Wu's workshop on "The Art of Reward and Punishment." These two workshop recordings may be ordered altogether on one data CD, or separately on either data or audio CD's, but Dr. Lai's workshop requires two CD's if ordered as audio CD due to the length. The seminar of "Facing Stress, Loss, and Suffering in Today's World" consists of Dr. Edward Lai's workshop on "Stress and Relaxation," Ruth Wu's workshop on "Dealing with Suffering/Loss," and a special guest testimony by Dominic Yang about his counseling experience as a young adult and it's impact on his life. Each can be ordered on three separate audio CD's or all together on one data CD. Ruth Wu's seminar on "Out of the Dark Valleys: Emerging from Crises in Work, Family, and Ministry" is available on one data CD or two audio CD's.

Future recordings available will be noted on our website. At the early part of this learning curve on making these recordings and building our library of recordings available for the community, CD's are available for a suggested donation of \$5 for one CD and \$10 for a set of 3 CD's. Some of these recordings may also include handouts and/or Power Point slides.
